





The General Assembly

Welcoming the adoption by the Human Rights Council, in its resolution 39/12 of 28 September 2018, of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and Other People Working in Rural Areas,

- 1. Adopts the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and Other People Working in Rural Areas, as contained in the annex to the present resolution;
- NON-BINDING Invites Governments, agencies and organizations of the United Nations
- VERY BROAD SCOPE rgovernmental and non-governmental organizations to disseminate the
- COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH REGARDING THE RIGHTS OF RURAL POPULATIONS, LINKING THEIR VULNERABILITIES, THEIR SPECIAL RELATIONSHIP TO LAND, WATER, SEEDS, AND NATURAL RESOURCES, AND THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO GLOBAL FOOD SECURITY, THROUGH INDIVIDUAL AND COLLECTIVE RIGHTS
- STATES' OBLIGATIONS WITH REGARD TO AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT
- INTEGRATION OF NOVEL CONCEPTS (FOOD SOVEREIGNTY, AGRARIAN REFORM, SOCIAL FUNCTION OF LAND)
- FAR TOO EARLY TO DISCUSS IMPLEMENTATION POTENTIAL
- PRIMARY ROLE OF LA VIA CAMPESINA IN NEGOTIATIONS (CLAYES AND EDELMAN, 2020)

Soft-law instrument; majority voting in the HRC and UNGA


A RARE CASE OF DIRECT INVOLVEMENT OF SOCIAL MOVEMENTS IN INTERNATIONAL LAW-MAKING (CLAYES AND EDELMAN, 2020)

- CONCERTED SOCIAL MOVEMENT ACTION AS A DRIVER OF INT LAW DEVELOPMENT
- PROCESS: TRANSFORMATION OF POLITICAL SPACE AND OF RULE-MAKING (BOTH FOR LVC AND FOR THE INSTITUTIONS INVOLVED) – "CONSTITUTIVE" USE OF HR TO TRANSFORM THE ECONOMIC PARADIGM (COTULA, 2020): OPENING PATH FOR TRANSFORMATIVE GOVERNANCE?
- SUBSTANCE: NOVEL HR CONFIGURATIONS WITH EMPHASIS ON MEANS OF PRODUCTION (COTULA, 2020); STRONG RELATION BETWEEN HR NORMS AND SOCIAL JUSTICE
- EXPANSION OF HR LANGUAGE (ONLY "LANGUAGE OF RESISTANCE" IN INT LAW - RAJAGOPAL, 2003)
 TOWARDS MORE CONTEXTUAL UNDERSTANDINGS AND REFLECTION OF COLLECTIVE IDENTITIES

SCHOLARSHIP

- LIMITED ENGAGEMENT OF INTERNATIONAL LAW SCHOLARS WITH SOCIAL MOVEMENTS, INCL. SEED ACTIVISM AND AGRARIAN MOVEMENTS, DUE TO LIMITATIONS OF TRADITIONAL LEGAL APPROACHES
- LIMITED ENGAGEMENT OF SOCIAL MOVEMENTS SCHOLARS WITH SOCIO-LEGAL APPROACHES
- NEED FOR INTERNATIONAL LAW SCHOLARS TO
 - "TAKE SOCIAL MOVEMENTS SERIOUSLY"
 - ENGAGE WITH SOCIAL MOVEMENTS LITERATURE
 - DEVELOP THE LANGUAGE AND CONCEPTS NEEDED TO ACCOMMODATE NEW REALITIES INTO LAW, MAKE PLACE FOR RESISTANCE AND FOR DEVELOPMENT OF OTHER "COMMON SENSES"/ALTERNATIVE MODERNITIES
- RESEARCH PATHS
 - PEASANT RIGHTS
 - CLIMATE LITIGATION
 - EARTH JURISPRUDENCE
- POTENTIAL INSPIRATION
 - CLS AND SOCIO-LEGAL APPROACHES
 - LEGAL MOBILIZATION APPROACHES
 - PLURIVERSALITY AND DEGROWTH
